Goal #4: Secure and strengthen home-school-community connections and communications.

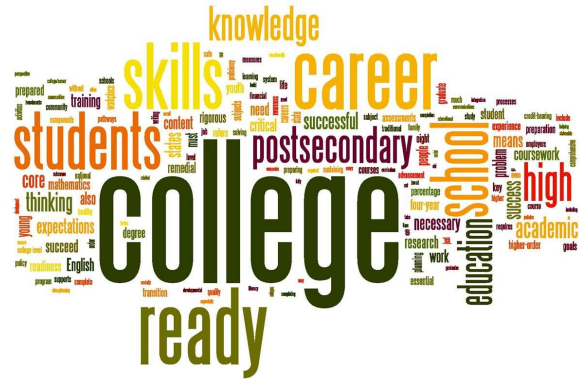


Daily Attendance Is Important

Students earn attendance credit based on the work completed during the week. It is critical that students complete 20-30 hours a week in their course of study. In addition, students are required to attend weekly, one hour per core class at the site. Labs are open on Tuesdays - Fridays from 12:25- 3:10 pm.

Students who do not demonstrate adequate weekly progress will meet with administration and counseling to complete an evaluation and may be placed on academic probation.

Counseling Corner

Academic Counseling

Students meet with their academic counselor to review credits earned and graduation requirements. The academic counselor meets with students on a weekly basis to review progress, offer guidance, support and encouragement.

Career Counseling

The academic counselor works with students in identifying their interests by administering a career assessment. Students participate in field trips to local colleges and universities. In addition, students and staff participate in Career Days scheduled in both first and second semester. Students are given opportunities to speak with professionals regarding their education and experience.

Psychological/Social Counseling

Scholar+ offers counseling services to assist students in their social emotional development.



Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS)

In California, MTSS is an integrated, comprehensive framework that focuses on CCSS, core instruction, differentiated learning, student-centered learning, individualized student needs, and the alignment of systems necessary for all students' academic, behavioral, and social success. California has a long history of providing numerous systems of support. These include the interventions within the RtI2 processes, supports for Special Education, Title I, Title III, support services for English Learners, American-Indian students, and those in gifted and talented programs.

MTSS offers the potential to create needed systematic change through intentional design and redesign of services and supports that quickly identify and match the needs of all students. SOLA will work hand-in-hand with the district to support ALL students in their social, emotional and academic development.

Awards Assemblies

Students are acknowledged for their efforts in academics, good citizenships, and attendance during the award assemblies scheduled every six weeks starting in the second semester.

Makerspace

A makerspace is a collaborative work space inside a school, library or separate public/private facility for making, learning, exploring and sharing that uses high tech to no tech tools. These spaces are open to kids, adults, and entrepreneurs and have a variety of maker equipment including 3D printers, laser cutters, cnc machines, soldering irons and even sewing machines. A makerspace however doesn't need to include all of these machines or even any of them to be considered a makerspace.
